PUBLIC HEARING:

<u>ORDINANCE 723-19</u> AN ORDIANCE AMENDING THE TOWN OF GRAMERCY CODE OF ORIDNANCES, CHAPTER 74, SECTION 74-41 FURNISHING WATER TO OTHERS

There being no comments on the above ordinance, Mayor Nosacka closed the public hearing and continued with regular order of business.

PRESENTATION AND COMMENTS - None

REPORTS

1. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Nosacka reported that the request for Capital Outlay funding request has been submitted. A notice of sale for the adjudicated property at 904 E. Railroad is being advertised and sale is set December 6, 2019. A crack in the street near 215 N. Pine Street is getting larger; water is washing out the layer under the street and is in need of repair. A special meeting is called for Monday, November 18, 2019 at 6:00 pm to fill the Alderman, District 1 vacancy.

The costs for the barricade on E. 10th Street is approximately \$4,176.00. A motion to continue with project was made by Alderman Louque, seconded by Alderman Calcagno and was approved.

2. REPORT ON-GOING PROJECT

Mayor Nosacka stated that Entergy has completed the power upgrade by Dudley Pump Station. We are waiting for guidelines from LA DOTD and CN concerning E. Railroad Avenue Re-location project. Bid packs for the ground storage stank repairs will be mailed out next week and bid opening is set for December 3, 2019.

3. REPORTS OF DEPARTMENT HEADS AND DIRECTORS

A. CHIEF OF POLICE

Police Chief Brent Dicharry stated that Halloween was successful and there were no incidents to report. He has spoken with a towing company about removing several tagged cars. The new GPS for the Police Department will be through Verizon; the program provides more information and costs less than old program.

B. REPORT FROM EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Lt. Jody Ordeneaux stated that during the tropical event in October there were several residents out of electricity for several hours. During the recent rain event about 3" of water was on the street in first block of N. Montz; it is suggested the board find the drainage issue in this area.

C. CODE ENFORCEMENT

Mr. Ronald Boudreaux reported that he continues to speak with residents concerning abandoned cars and has tagged vehicles when owners do not remove the vehicle. There have been several roof replacement jobs that were started without permits; however after notification the contractors did file for a permit.

A. PLANNING COMMISSION

Mayor Nosacka reported that the Planning Commission recommends the approval of the building permit for MUZU Inc. on Deroche Circle.

Mr. Craig Calcagno passed out his monthly report. The soccer and football fields have been cut. Parking was better at the last game due to effort of signs, striping and parking blocks. The parish electricians came for electrical hook up by tennis courts. They are looking into upgrading the present park signs.
