PUBLIC COMMENTS – There were no comments made on agenda items.

PRESENTATION AND COMMENTS

Mr. Andrew Cola, 139 S Mulberry Street, spoke of a neighbor that installed a fence that was too close to his original fence and the grass cannot be mowed. He is asking if the town can have the neighbor tear down the fence and move it two feet so grass can be mowed. He complained of a neighbor who has a dog and they are not cleaning up the yard and there is an odor and flies; he cannot be in his back yard because of this problem.

REPORTS

1. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Bourgeois stated that he contacted Premier Services, LLC from Walker to begin street light repairs on N. Pine Street, N. Magnolia Street, and W. Sixth Street. Scott Blank has been hired as our new Maintenance Manager. A sidewalk repair on N. Pine Street turned into a 6" water main repair. Tony Arikol with PEC, recommended Grady Crawford Construction Co. Inc., for the Dudley Pump Force Main Relocation Project. Mr. Arikol will also seek three quotes for the N. Airline Sewer Pump improvements project.

A. REPORT FROM CHIEF OF POLICE

Mr. Brent Dicharry, Chief of Police, reported that they were cleaning up the Police Department and thankful for the extra space to work on their vehicles. Lt. Ordeneaux was involved in an accident while responding to a call. He suffered a minor shoulder injury and the vehicle is repairable. Alderman Brack asked if we could move the speed detecting machine to different locations? Chief Dicharry stated he will move the machine to different locations throughout town.

RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION NO. 19-2023

A RESOLUTION TO EXPRESS DISAPPROVAL OF CONSTRUCTION OF TWO CLASS V TEST INJECTION WELLS BY AIR PRODUCTS IN THE LAKE MAUREPAS BOTTOM. THESE TEST WELLS BY AIR PRODUCTS ARE PART OF THE FIRST STEP TO DETERMINE IF THE AREA UNDER LAKE MAUREPAS IS SUITABLE FOR CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE OF VAST QUANTITIES OF CARBON DIXOXIDE (CO2) THOUSANDS OF FEET BENEATH THE LAKE. THE TOWN COUNCIL IS OPPOSED TO THE LOCATION OF THIS PROJECT, AND THIS RESOLUTION IS A METHOD TO VOICE OUR OPPOSITION AND CONCERNS ON THIS PROJECT. WE AS A TOWN COUNCIL SUPPORT THE LIVINGSTON PARISH REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATORS WHO ARE WORKING IN THE BEST INTEREST OF OUR CITIZENS CONCERNING POSSIBLE LEGISLATION CONCERNING SEQUESTRATION AS IT RELATES TO LAKE MAUREPAS AND THE SURROUNDING CYPRESS/TUPELO SWAMP AREA

WHEREAS, the Coastal restoration Protection Agency (CPRA) is spending millions of state and federal funds to restore the Maurepas Swamp,

WHEREAS, Air Products would have to build a pipeline through the Cypress/Tupelo swamp and in several adjacent parishes to connect their industrial site in Ascension Parish to Lake Maurepas,

WHEREAS, those Cypress/Tupelo swamp lands are our hurricane and storm surge buffer, as seen from recent storms,

WHEREAS, Lake Maurepas is a recreational and commercial fishery that many residents and businesses rely on,

WHEREAS, there are alternative sites that could be considered, such as depleted oil fields in the Gulf of Mexico,

WHEREAS, Lake Pontchartrain has a moratorium on all new oil and gas drilling. In 2000, the Mineral Board stated that it considered the lake to be a sensitive location and extended the moratorium indefinitely. Lake Maurepas should have the same protection against any type of industrial activity.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Gramercy Board of Aldermen express disapproval of the proposed construction of the two Class V test injection wells and multiple Class VI Carbon Dioxide injection wells by Air Products in the Lake Maurepas bottom. The Town of Gramercy Board of Alderman calls for a moratorium to be approved against any drilling in Lake Maurepas.

Alderman Williams reported a lot of traffic on Rose Street and asked the Police Department to patrol more often in that area. He asked if Mr. Faucheux could contact LSR concerning the level of noise from the refinery.

Alderman Wiggins reported high grass letters need to be sent to property owners on S. Plum Street, S. Millet Street, and S. Sycamore Street. He asked if someone could contact DOTD to report Main Street red light was not set correctly.

Alderman Calcagno passed out his monthly report. He reported there is a lack of house numbers in the town. Hurricane season will begin soon and would like to remind residents to clean up their property, check their generators and stock up on supplies that may be needed.

TOWN ATTORNEY

Mr. Faucheux stated it was good to be back. The Attorney General opinion is favorable to the Town pursuing the landowner and owner of structure for costs of demolition. He has continued conversation with Mr. Randy Anny concerning the annexation of area behind Sandwich World.

There being no further business it was moved by Alderman Calcagno, second by Alderman Brack and approved to adjourn at 6:47 pm.
